Please note: All students are required to read the Graduate's School's on-line bulletin and fulfill all graduate school requirements in addition to departmental requirements for graduation. See the Graduate Program Guidebook for details.

The program of study must consist of 16 or more hours of 8000- and 9000-level courses **in addition to** research, dissertation writing, and directed study.

The program of study for a student who bypasses the master's degree must contain 4 semester hours of University of Georgia courses open only to graduate students in addition to 16 semester hours of 8000 and 9000 level courses. **9005, Doctoral research (9000), independent study courses, and dissertation writing (9300) may not be counted in these 20 hours.**

A final program of study will be submitted to the Graduate School in Grad Status prior to notification of the comprehensive examination. This program of study must be submitted on the proper form for approval by the advisory committee, the graduate coordinator, and the dean of the Graduate School. The final program of study must show all graduate courses relevant to the doctoral program and not just courses satisfying the minimum degree requirement. Courses from the master's degree and courses taken at other universities should be listed in the "Relevant Master's or Other Graduate Degree Courses" section of the program of study form. **The PhD program of study must carry a minimum of 30 hours of course work three hours of which must be dissertation writing (9300).**
